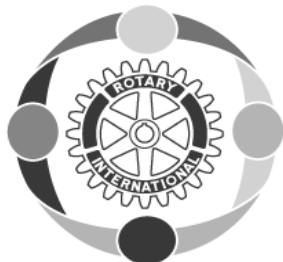

#### CLUB PROCEEDINGS

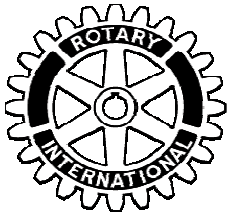
Pres Kay called the meeting to order at 12:30 pm and led the Rotary Prayer, and followed with the Pledge of Allegiance.

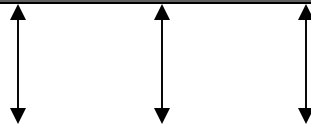

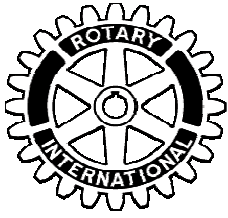
The Speaker thanked Rtn Julie for the Rotary invitation and the opportunity to further introduced Memorial Home Health and Hospice services.

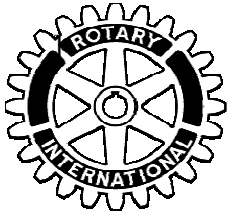
It is abundantly apparent that our communities are better places to live because of Rotary clubs and the work of Rotarians.
