Rtn Julie Kreilick for our late PP Earl Christy's grandson who spoke Saturday night at St Paul's church.

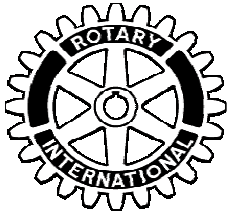
PP Tom Hoffman for opening day for baseball

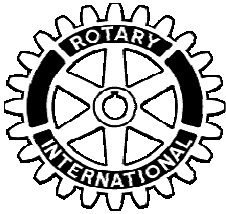

PROGRAM OF THE DAY

Speaker - Ms. Carol Manbeck
Topic - "Child Abuse & Awareness Month"

President Helene invited Immediate Past President Kay Reiter to introduce today's guest speakers, Ms. Carol Manbeck, PR coordinator of CASA of Seneca, Sandusky and Wyandot Counties.

Ms. Manbeck spoke to the group on the importance of the organization, CASA. CASA stands for "Court Appointed Special Advocate." CASA helps the court system in cases of abused children. More than 2200 children are involved in abuse investigations each year, and last year the staff and volunteers of CASA served 410 children.

CASA volunteers go through a 30-hour training course covering topics such as laws governing child abuse, court process, cultural awareness and confidentiality. A CASA volunteer attends all hearings, reports credible information, and continues to monitor the case until it closes. CASA volunteers have a responsibility to make recommendations to the court that have

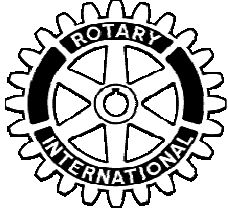
nothing but the child's best interest in mind. It is their duty to make sound recommendations to the court to offer the child their support, time, trust, confidence, a voice in court and potential for a better future.

CASA began in Seneca County in 1990, in Sandusky County in 1992 and Wyandot County in 1998. CASA has helped over 2800 children and have 94 volunteers who have put in over 6300 hours in Sandusky County alone. Nearly 2/3 of CASA's budget relies on local funding.

CASA will be holding a "Light of Hope" event at noon on Apr 15 at the Sandusky County Courthouse to help bring awareness to child abuse and child abuse prevention. CASA will also be holding a fundraiser Apr 29 at the Fremont Moose.

David V. Daugherty has been a member of Rotary since 1975 with membership in the Rotary Clubs of Inkster, Michigan; Hartford, Connecticut; and Mansfield, Ohio.

He served as President of Hartford (Connecticut) Rotary in 1986-1987 and Mansfield (Ohio) Rotary in 2001-2002. In Connecticut, he was an Assistant District Governor for two terms and served in a variety of leadership posts. Daugherty serves as Editor of the weekly Email Newsletter and the monthly Amplifier Newsletter of the Mansfield Rotary Club. He served District 6600 as Registration Chairman for Rotary International President Carl-Wilhelm Stenhammar's visit to Ohio in October 2005 and for the 2006 District 6600 Conference.

He is the former President/CEO of Rehabilitation Service of North Central Ohio, Inc. (The Rehab Center), a position he held from July 1996 until his retirement in July 2002.

Daugherty has held significant leadership positions in the field of rehabilitation including Chairman of the Boards of Directors of the American Rehabilitation Association and the National Industries for the Severely Handicapped.

David is Past-President of Board of Directors of the Richland County Regional Planning Commission, a member and Past Chairman of the Leadership Unlimited Members Group, a volunteer for the Richland County United Way, and Treasurer of the Oak Run Lake Association. In September 2005, Daugherty was named by Governor Bob Taft to serve as a Commissioner on the Ohio Rehabilitation Services Commission.

DGN Daugherty lives in Mansfield with his wife, Jennifer, a registered nurse at Columbus Children's Hospital. Their children include Loraine, the President of Apollo Enterprises in Utah; Dr. Margaret, a Professor at Middlebury College in Vermont; David, Jr., a Transportation Supervisor for an Assisted Living Facility in Florida; Patrick, a Director for Pharmerica in Florida; Kelly Brian, a Manager for Pharmerica in Longmont, Colorado; and Benjamin, an employee of Roto-Studio in Dublin, Ohio.
