President Helene called the meeting to order at 12:15 pm. She led members in the Rotary Prayer and followed with the Pledge of Allegiance.

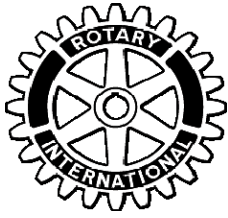
Sgt-at-arms (SAA) Rtn Tim Piercefield welcomed all Guests.

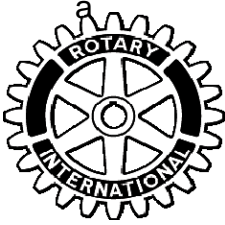

After the promo video, Ms Babione talked about major gifts campaign with a focus on raising funds for:

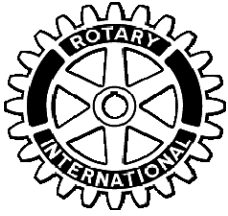
- instructional equipment and technology upgrades

President Wilf encourages clubs to adopt the same recognition incentive for their members. For Rotarians who sponsor more than one new member, additional recognition can be displayed with a numbered tab that attaches to the pin.

## EVERY ROTARIAN AN EXAMPLE TO YOUTH

In 1949, the RI Board adopted the slogan Every Rotarian an Example to Youth as an expression of commitment to children and youth in each community in which Rotary Clubs exist. Serving young people has long been an important part of the Rotary program.

Youth service projects take many forms around the world. Rotarians sponsor Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, athletic teams, centers for disabled children, school safety patrols, summer camps, recreation areas, safe driving clinics, county fairs, child care centers, and children's hospitals. Many clubs provide vocational counseling, establish youth employment programs, and promote use of The Four-Way Test. Increasingly, drug or alcohol abuse prevention and HIV/AIDS awareness projects are being supported by Rotarians.

In every instance, Rotarians have an opportunity to be role models for the young people of their community. One learns to serve by observing others. As our youth grow to become adult leaders, it is hoped each will achieve that same desire and spirit to serve future generations.

The slogan accepted over 50 years ago is just as vital today!

## **a little info about our Rtn Marsha Bordner...**

The program speaker today is our own fellow member, Dr. Marsha Bordner!

Currently she is the President of Terra Community College. Rtn Marsha received her Bachelor of Arts in English and German from Bowling Green State University in 1972. She then received her Master of Arts Degree in English from BGSU in 1974. Rtn Marsha received her Ph.D in English from The Ohio State University in 1979.

Rtn Marsha began her career at Clark State Community College in Springfield, Ohio as a faculty member in the Arts and Sciences Division. She then served as Chairperson of the General Education Department at Clark State and later assumed the position of Assistant Dean of the Arts and Sciences Division. In 1994, Rtn Marsha was appointed Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs at Clark State and has served in that role until she joined Terra assuming her current position in October 2003.
