PP Tom Hoffman for attending the concert with IPP Kay, however, he was seated way back;

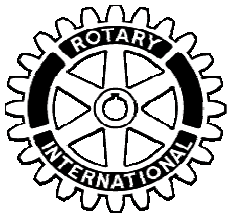

This is the 1st meeting scheduled for all Past Presidents to meet on Aug 29, Wed at Noon.

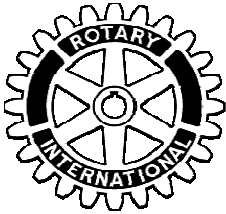

Topic – “1ST CLUB ASSEMBLY”

President Helene presided over the 1st Club Assembly in this Rotary year and presented the following goals:

Goal #1-To continue to work on scheduling better programs and add more fun to our existing meetings
>>This is an ongoing project.

Goal #2-To find out member satisfaction with our club
>>Circulated membership development questionnaire 2 months ago, received 32 replies. President Helene shared findings with members.

Goal #3-Hold at least two club assemblies to inform members of projects, committee reports, etc.
>>Achieved 50% of this goal.

Goal #4-To formalize a New Member Orientation Program
>>The Membership/Orientation sub-committee is working on a Membership Orientation Handbook for new members.

Goal #5-To increase membership by 25%
>>This is an ongoing project.

Goal #6- Once again, become active in the Youth Exchange Program by having one outbound student and one inbound student next year
>>The sub-committee has been set up. They will meet with the District Chairperson soon and attend the orientation programs.

Goal #7- Better information to you and the public through a Public Relations Campaign
>>This is an ongoing project.

Goal #8-A local project that will make Campfire/Misty Meadows a “premier camp” for youth
Our local project for this year is Camp Fire / Misty Meadow, a personal dedication to PDG LaMar Christy who spearheaded this project from the start. It will be called “Project Extreme Makeover”.

Members viewed a 12 minute video on “Reuniting Kids with Nature”.

Goal #9-To choose one international project in which some of Rotarians will visit the country where the project is implemented
>>Rtn Jim Toews & Rtn Kim Theller talked about donating used school supplies to MESA. Rtn Jim contacted Gary Davis of MESA Warehouse at Waterville. Our donation will either be sent to EL Salvador or Belize. The committee is still finalizing details. Will provide updated info later.

>>Rtn Jim and President Helene are inviting members to join them at Uniendo America Project Fair, Jan 24-28, 2008 in Costa Rica. Details to follow.

Goal #10-In order to fund our local and international project, we will have a number of fundraisers. In turn, we can then apply for District Simplified Grants and Matching Funds

>>Rtn Linda Havens & Rtn Cindy Abdoo talked about the 1st fund raising project – Selling Fried Ice Cream at the Sandusky County Fair. Members will be separated in 3 teams (one for each day) and compete for the highest sales team. Rtn Cindy & her committee will provide final details by next week.

Goal #11-Work towards our club being a 100% Paul Harris Fellows
>>This is an ongoing project.
