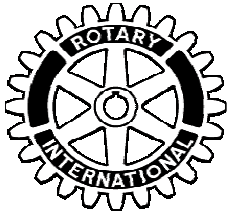

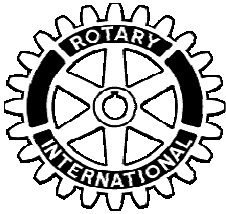

Brenda's bio notes:

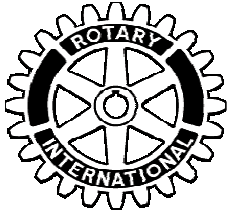
- Born and raised in Fremont
