PP Dan H Lease, PP Dennis Newman, Rtn Hal Hawk & Rtn Elaine Blackmore for leaving the meeting early;

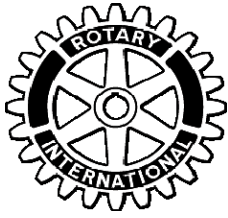
Visiting Rtn Elaine Blackmore paid \$5 for a copy of picture taken with RI President Wilfrid;

FRIED ICE CREAM FUNDRAISER REPORT BY RTN. CINDY ABDOO

At the Rotary Club of Fremont's first fundraising venture to raise money for "Project Extreme Makeover" to benefit the children of our community by revamping the Campfire program and Misty Meadows, members of Fremont Rotary sold fried ice cream over a 3 day span at the Sandusky County Fair.

Joining the Campfire group at the Country Kitchen, 34 Rotarians/4 Spouses/1 Friend of Rotary combined their efforts to assemble, deep fry and serve up a fried ice cream treat to the many people who stopped by the Country Kitchen.

While working hard to benefit the children of the community, fellowship was shared amongst Rotarians. While not all Rotarians proved to be culinary experts, a great time was had by all.

While the goal was to sell 1,000 units, the Club sold 191 and collected \$807.50. There were several reasons for not achieving our goal, which included a short time in preparation, lack of publicity due to location, hot & humid weather, and the low fair attendance.

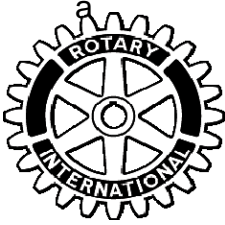

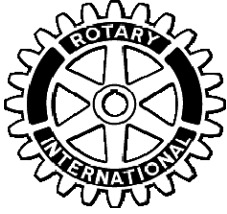
President Helene thanked Rtn Julie and presented Principal Hernandez a souvenir as a token of our appreciation.
