Sgt-at-arms (SAA) Rtn Jim Yeager welcomed all Guests.

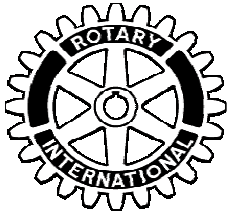

At its November 2002 meeting, the RI Board of Directors adopted the following policy:

Recommendations About Privacy for Club, District, and Other Rotary-Related Web Sites

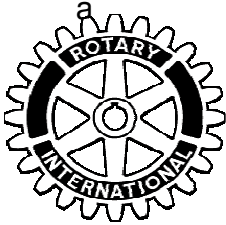
RI recommends Rotarians follow similar guidelines when using personal information on the Internet, e-mail, and district, club, or other Rotary-related Web sites. Rotarians might consider:

Not posting what could be considered sensitive personal information, such as name, address, e-mail address, telephone number, etc., without written permission from that Rotary club member.

Using password-protected areas, where only members with passwords can log in, if information needs to be shared.

In general, all Rotarian users of the Internet should keep in mind that although one cannot control who views information on the Internet, one could control what is posted. Always consider the ramifications of posting sensitive data of Rotary club members and sharing e-mail messages with addresses of other Rotarians with third parties. In addition, countries impose different standards on how personal information can be used. You may want to consider consulting with an expert before any personal information is used.

times and maintained a .331 batting average.

4. Coming out of retirement, batting for only the sixth time in the 1974 season, Harlan hit a home run to set a new single-season home-run record (65) for Ashland Faultless Rubber

President Helene invited Rtn Lee Bowden to introduce Mr. Lyle Hamilton, the brainchild and also the master of ceremony for today’s special event.

- Harlan’s playing days included: playing on teams that finished third, fourth and tenth in the nation, a member of three regional championship teams, playing on a state championship team, three regional runners-ups and one regional third place team.
- Upon retirement at age 44, Faultless Rubber presented Harlan with an Automobile Club trip-tick showing the way from Fremont to Ashland. It was estimated that Harlan had driven over 25,000 miles from Fremont to Ashland during his playing career.
- Currently he lives with his wife, Betty, in Fremont.

Mr. Hamilton thanked the Club and Rtn Lee for hosting the salute to Fremont’s Finest fast-pitch softball player, Mr. Keith Harlan, a salute which reaches from local fields to the nation’s softball finals. He invited Mayor Terry Overmyer to the podium for official proclamation of August 13 as Keith Harlan Day in Fremont. Mayor Overmyer presented the proclamation certificate to Keith.

Mr. Hamilton continued to introduce the guest of honor, Mr. Keith Harlan.

- A 1944 graduate of Ross High School, Harlan played baseball and softball in Fremont on championship teams during the 1950s and 60s, reaching the climax of his 25-year playing career with the Faultless Rubber team in the national softball finals during 1966-68.
- He was a member of the 1957 Fremont Milton’s Fifth District Softball Championship Team which was the first ever local team to play in the finals of the Ohio softball tournament.
- Harlan, who played first base, hit routinely between .300 and .400 year after year. Some of his numerous accomplishments include:
 1. Hit a triple in the 19th inning of the 1957 Lorain Classic softball tournament.
 2. Named the most valuable player in the 1967 East Central Regional Fast Pitch tournament.
 3. Played in 476 games for Faultless Rubber, batted 1,428

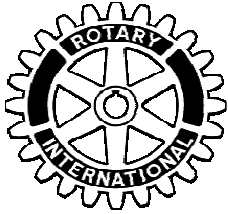
