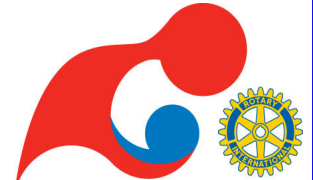

Oak Harbor is their main facility for conducting programming. Affiliate sites include Eagle Creek in Norwalk, Keys in Perkins, Fremont Country Club in Fremont and Crosswinds in Perrysburg. 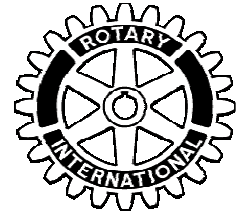
President Rob thanked Rtn Angelica for an interesting presentation.

THIS WEEK’S PROGRAM

Topic: “Impact of Terra on Our Community”

Rotarian Tony Camilleri introduced the speaker, Rotarian Dr. Marsha Bordner, President of Terra Community College.

Rtn Dr. Bordner spoke to the group on the economic impact of Terra Community College on the local community. The main focus of this study has been to answer the questions "Has Terra been, and does it continue to be, a good investment for the community," and "Has Terra been a good investment and continues to be a good investment for students?" Terra employs roughly 300 people who account for approximately 9 million in earnings. Terra is responsible for infusing 12 million into the local economy. Terra works with local vendors 80% of the time. Of students who attend Terra, 75% stay in the region. Since the inception of Terra, 643,000 credit hours have been earned. Each dollar a student invests in credit hours is worth \$7.60. Terra students' collective income infused into the local economy over the course of a year is roughly 200 million. Terra's social effect on the community equates to approximately \$600,000 in social savings. The annual return for students on their time and money invested in Terra is 21%. □□
