President Helene welcomed all Visiting Rotarian and Guests.

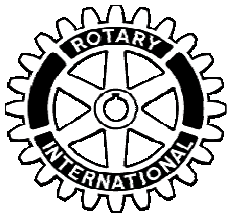
HAPPY BUCKS session did not take place.

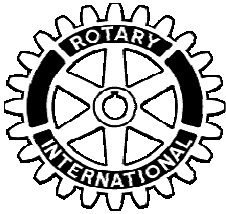

PRESIDENT'S ANNOUNCEMENTS

- 3) Paul Harris Fellow (PHF) - Rtn. Dick Binau reminded members that matching monies are available toward becoming a Paul Harris Fellow.

Paul Harris Fellow/Multiple Paul Harris Fellow

Anyone who contributes US\$1,000 or more to the Annual Programs Fund or has that amount contributed in their name may become a **Paul Harris Fellow**. Each new Paul Harris Fellow receives a commemorative certificate, a pin, and a medallion. For gifts of \$2,000 or more, a Paul Harris Fellow is eligible for recognition as a **Multiple Paul Harris Fellow**.

Matching Fund for Fremont Rotary Club members

Your donation can mean a world of difference. For example, a contribution of \$100 can fund one year of tuition and books for two children in Kenya. If you give \$100 per year through EREY (Every Rotarian Every Year), you automatically become a **Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member**.

If a Rotarian gives \$100 per year, it will take 10 years to become a PHF. However Fremont Rotary Club is going to assist its member in shortening the process as follows:

- 1) Member gives \$100; Club will match \$200 (\$100 from the annual lottery fund; \$100 from Club's accrued recognition points);
- 2) Member gives \$200; Club will match \$400; and so forth.

The member can become a PHF between 3-4 years or shorter time period.

PROGRAM OF THE DAY

Speaker – Rotarian Jerry Clark
Topic – "Atlas Industries Inc."

President Helene invited Rotarian Jerry Clark, President and CEO of Atlas Industries Inc to introduce the company – its history and background.

Atlas Industries was started by Theodore E. Clark (Rtn Jerry's grandfather) in 1943 after his employment with GM. During WWII, Atlas manufactured military products using German prisoners of war in their manufacturing endeavors. By 1971 Atlas had locations in Gibsonburg, Tiffin and Fremont totaling 272,000 square feet of space.

Rtn Jerry introduced his fellow corporate staff at the meeting, whom also served as tour guides after meeting.

Mr. Ryan Clark continued with a power point presentation.

This year Atlas celebrates 65 years of

supplying precision machined crankshafts, buying, selling and designing machine tools, and providing supplemental manufacturing capabilities to customers all over the world.

Currently Atlas has three locations in Fremont, Tiffin and Gibsonburg, occupying 525,000 square feet and employing 400-500 people.

Following the information given by Rtn Jerry and Ryan Clark, members and guests were split into small groups, led on a tour of the expansive facilities. Also Atlas Industries gave every guests a company mug as souvenir!
