PP Tom Hoffman for his son won 2nd place, his goal, at the pinewood derby.

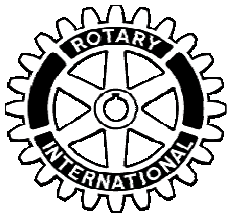
Rtn Jim Ellis for insisting that he did not have the slowest car at the pinewood derby.

## WHAT TO EXPECT IN 2008-09 ROTARY YEAR

### Lee asks Rotarians to ‘Make Dreams Real’ for world’s children

Rotary International President-elect Dong Kurn Lee addressed incoming district governors today at the 2008 International Assembly, urging them to use their resources to help curb child mortality. Lee said he was in disbelief when he learned that 30,000 children under the age of five die every day from preventable diseases such as pneumonia, measles, and malaria.

"Once I understood the issues behind that terrible number, I knew what I needed to do," Lee said. He told the incoming governors that Rotary will keep the service emphases of recent years -- water, health and hunger, and literacy -- but asked them to focus their efforts in each of these areas on children.

"In 2008-09, I will ask you all to **Make Dreams Real** for the world's children," he said. "This will be our theme, and my challenge to all of you."

"Children are killed by illnesses that become deadly in combination with poor sanitation

and malnutrition," Lee said. In addition, families stricken by extreme poverty are trapped in a cycle that only leads to more unnecessary deaths. "It's a cycle that is not interrupted because there is no access to education."

He challenged the audience to do their part to give children "hope and a chance at a future" by reducing the rate of child mortality in the world.

"We will bring clean water to their communities and create sanitation projects that keep children healthy," Lee said.

In 2008-09, Rotarians will be asked to open their eyes to the needs of children in communities near and far, Lee said.

"Children die not because nobody can help them, but because too often, nobody does. But you and I, here in this room, are Rotarians, and helping is what we do best," he said, adding that "our job is to Make Dreams Real for children. If every one of us does this, at the end of our year, we will all have achieved something wonderful."

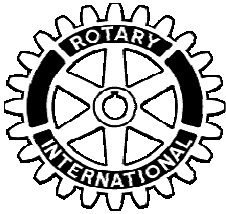

## PROGRAM OF THE DAY

Speaker – Mr. Dave Torres  
Topic – “Stylecrest Logistics, Inc.”

President Helene invited Past President Bill Goad to introduce the guest speaker, Dave Torres, Director of Business Development.

Style Crest has been involved in 3rd party logistics for 25 years. They are a 3rd party provider of public and contract warehousing and provide repack, co-pack and distribution services. Stylecrest Logistics employs about thirty associates including professional logistics management, warehousemen, professional drivers, and professional administrative office staff.

The Stylecrest buildings around the Fremont area currently occupy several hundred-thousand square feet of space. The building on Majestic Drive occupies 144,000 square feet, the Bark Creek Dr. Building occupies 268,000 square feet, the Graham Dr location occupies 75,000 square feet, the Green Springs building occupies 50,000 square feet, two buildings in Bellevue occupy 40,000 and 60,000 square feet, and the building at 3G occupies 400,000 square feet.

All of these buildings are food grade, which meet the standards to be able to store food. Stylecrest Logistics is in fact the only AIB (American Institute of Bakers) participant to have a "Superior" rating which comes from

participation in the strict auditing and training program through AIB.

Stylecrest's transportation sector boasts a fleet of 8 tractors and 45 food grade quality trailers. They provide local cartage to customers, expedited airfreight services, storage trailer rentals, and local same-day delivery.

It is the goal of Stylecrest Logistics to make 2008 a year of growth and improvement. The company is looking to grow an additional 50% and invest in an upgraded warehouse management system.

Over the next five years, Stylecrest Logistics is not only looking to expand to different areas such as Toledo and Findlay, they are also looking to grow to \$20 million in gross sales.

Following the talk given by Mr. Torres, Rotarians were led on a tour of the impressive Bark Creek Dr facility.
